Can you offer a young person a job placement that will give them the experience they need?

The Kickstart Scheme is all about helping young people at risk of long-term unemployment get into the job market by providing government funding for employers to create job placements.

What is the kickstart scheme?

- A 6-month work placement for 16-24 year olds on Universal Credit and at risk of long-term unemployment.
- Placements should be for new jobs, not replacing current or planned jobs.
- Wages paid by the government, for up to 25 hours a week at national minimum wage (NMW). Funding also covers associated employer NI contributions and minimum automatic enrolment contributions. Employers can decide to pay for additional hours or top-up the NMW.
- Additional £1,500 paid per job placement, available for setup costs, support and training
- Once a placement has been completed successfully another young person can take the placement, attracting further funding.
- Employer may decide to transfer the young person onto an Apprenticeship during or on completion of the placement and additional employer incentives may apply.

What businesses need to offer

- A job specification for the placement(s).
- An interview process, to include reviewing applications and interviews.
- During the placement, the young person should receive support in developing their skills and experience to ensure they are work-ready upon completion of their placement. *
- All young people should receive careers advice, goal setting, CV writing and interview skills, along
 with developing the skills required within the role they are performing. *
- * Support can be offered by a Kickstart Gateway organisation (see below).

Eligibility and Applying

- Employers from all industries and across the private, public and voluntary sectors can apply.
- If you can offer more than 30 placements at one time in your business, you can apply direct.

- As most employers will have less than 30 placements, you can apply through a Kickstart Gateway organisation. Gateways make applications on behalf of multiple employers.
- Applications for funding can be made until end December 2021.

The Process - Gateway and Job Centre Work Coach can provide support throughout.

Employer contacts Gateway to discuss placement opportunities Employer provides job description(s), location, any specific requirements and potential start date Placement approved, local job centre matches candidates. Employer interview and selection

Placement ends.
Future opportunities and next steps discussed.
Placement may be offered to another young person.

Young person starts 6-month placement and employer agrees support/training

Kickstart Gateways
